- St. Mary's fosters in its students the spirit of community service. It is a graduation requirement that 8<sup>th</sup> graders perform 45 hours of service to the sick, poor, and convalescent in our community.
- St. Mary's encourages its students to become involved in community activities. Examples include hosting a Halloween Haunted House open to the public and participating in the annual Pumpkin Festival where the 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade have been Grand Sweepstakes Winners. Our students raised funds and food for Plowshares, the victims of Hurricane Katrina, the flooded Hopland Elementary School, and the American Heart Association and other charitable organizations.
- Through the creation of student 'school families,' St. Mary's fosters leadership and a respect for the talents and needs of students of other ages. Composed of groups of children from each grade under the direction of an older student, these students work together throughout the year in school activities.
- The St. Mary's faculty is committed to providing enrichment activities for their students such as living history field trips to the Gold Country, Fort Ross, and the USS Hornet as well as environmental education field trips to Point Reyes and MacKerricher State Park. The faculty also leads a biannual trip to Washington DC for 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders.
- St. Mary's students actively participate in the St. Mary's and Mendocino County Science Fairs. In 2007, St. Mary's sent 6 students to the County Science Fair and two students moved on to compete at the State Science Fair in Los Angeles. The majority of Ukiah's elementary and middle schools do not participate.
- St. Mary's parents are committed to the school and participate fully in the school functions and fundraising. Each family works over 30 hours per year at the school and the parent-sponsored annual fundraiser, Mardi Gras, raised over \$88,000 from the community for the school's operating budget in 2008.
