KINDERGARTEN

Kindergarten is busy getting ready for Thanksgiving! We are learning about the first Thanksgiving and talking about what it means to be thankful. We are also making turkey handprints and hats! In language arts, we are blending sounds, identifying letter names and sounds, and reading and writing high-frequency words. In math, we are comparing numbers to 10 and counting, reading, and writing numbers to 20!

FIRST

First grade had a lot of fun at Harvest Run! We had two winners who outdid themselves running laps. We are beginning our third anthology out of six in our first grade reading program. We have also began using our Science books- learning about environments and plants and animals that live in those environments. And we are having fun with some Thanksgiving art projects.

SECOND

Hello second grade. It is hard to believe we are already going into the month of December. This year feels like it is flying by. We are having a wonderful time in second grade, learning so much as we go. I look forward to seeing the presentations of our Family Units that we began working on in Social Studies at the end of November. In science, we have been working on our Weather Unit. It has been quite exciting completing our daily weather calendars with all the different weather we've been having here in our area. THIRD

Lots of exciting things are happening in Third Grade! We learned about El Salvadorian crosses and then painted wooden crosses of our own in class. We also began learning cursive! We wrote state reports in Social Studies and learned about the phases of the moon with Oreo cookies in Science!

FOURTH

In Fourth grade, we have been working through the writing process in reviewing, editing and publishing our "Pet Monster" stories. We have been reading the Newbery Medal award winning historical fiction novel Island of the Blue Dolphins as a class, as well as reading fiction novels in reading groups, reading informational text in class, and working hard reading independently towards A.R. word goals! In Math we have been working with the addition and subtraction of larger whole numbers, the hows and whys behind our base ten number system, and reviewing multiplication and division facts. In Science we have been studying several wonderfully different types of ecosystems with their living and nonliving parts. In Social Studies we learned about California geography's impact on the climate, vegetation, population, and lifestyle of Californians. We are carrying this knowledge into our study of Californian's indigenous people. November is Indian Heritage Month and we look forward to visiting the Sun House Museum to learn more about Indigenous Californian history, culture, and lifestyle upon return from Thanksgiving break. In December we will begin our study of the California Mission system. In Religion we have been working with prayer as well as focusing on thankfulness and gratitude for the many blessings we have.

SIXTH

Middle School English:

The 6th Grade completed their reading of The Cay, which included assignments related to the story: making mini rafts as well as Travel Brochures to an actual Cay (tropical island) of their choice. They have now begun to read Number the Stars, by Lois Lowry. The 7th Grade completed their reading of The Little Prince, as well as many projects related to that classic story. The 8th Grade completed John Steinbeck's The Pearl, about which they composed a five paragraph analytical essay. Additionally, the 7th and 8th graders recently read assorted works of Edgar Allan Poe, which included an Enigma Poem and a Hoax News Story. The students then wrote their own enigma poems and news hoaxes. In 8th Grade, the students are making great progress on their year-long Proteus projects, including completion of their first interviews with an expert on their chosen topics.

SEVENTH

For the month of December, 7th grade will be studying the ancient world of China. Dynasties, empires, oh my!

6th grade will be transitioning from cultural and religious India to capturing cultural China. 8th Grade will be diving into the Constitution!
