KINDERGARTEN

In kindergarten, we are learning that all living things change as they grow. We read From Caterpillar to Butterfly, a book about the life cycle of a butterfly. We are currently caring for our own caterpillars as they undergo metamorphosis. Over the course of three weeks, we will observe our caterpillars eat and grow, hang upside down and form chrysalides, and emerge as Painted Lady butterflies! In language arts, we are identifying letter names and sounds, blending words, reading and writing high-frequency words, and writing sentences. In math, we are adding and subtracting within 10.

FIRST

First graders are read, reading. Reading about Science-environments and the animals and plants that live in them. History- about our presidents Lincoln and Washington and Jefferson. Our Tuesday, Thursday running club is going strong! Lots of laps run and "feet' charms to show for it- 16 laps earns a "foot' charm. That is a lot of running!

SECOND

This year seems to be flying by! It's hard to believe that the month of March is upon us. I've enjoyed seeing all the dinosaur projects come in and I am excited to hear them presented in our class. Thank you for all your hard work and keep it up, God bless!

THIRD

We began our study of division in Math this month! We continue to focus on multiplication and the relationship between multiplication and division. Students have also been reading at their levels and taking Accelerated Reader tests to improve their fluency and comprehension. Each student has a goal that they are encouraged to meet each trimester with reading and many of our students have met their goals already! We are also looking forward to our Haiku poetry unit coming up!

FOURTH

Fourth grade has been working hard and having fun! Together our class has read over 13,386,483 words and we applaud five of our fourth grade students as members of the Millionaire Club. Students are busy writing everything in cursive, working with long division and multi-digit multiplication, and wrapping up their study of processes that shape our planet's landscapes including volcanoes and earthquakes. Students have completed mission research reports, studied the impact of the mission system on California's native people, and filled our hallway with mission models. I am so proud of our student's hard work, effort, and creativity!

SIXTH

In middle school English, the 6th Graders have begun their reading and detective work on the great mystery novel, The Westing Game. The 7th Graders are wrapping up their reading of The Call of the Wild, while the 8th Graders finish their reading of Johnny Tremain. The 8th Graders' main focus right now is the Proteus Project. They have just completed their 5-page drafts, with the 10-page drafts soon to follow. All grades continue to work on grade-level grammar lessons as well.

In Algebra-1 we are currently working with Systems of Equations Word Problems. I don't know how much the students like them, but I love 'em, and these problems are guaranteed to make you a better reader...and thinker!

SEVENTH

For the month of March, 7th grade will be studying the classical world of The Renaissance and how it changed life in Europe. 6th grade will be studying the Roman World, first learning all about the Roman Republic. 8th Grade will be diving into the Jefferson Era of our New Republic Nation. For P.E., we are jumping into Nutrition! Learning all about what goes in our food and what's the best food for our bodies. We will also be running a little bit more each day to train for the Mile! EIGHTH

St. Mary's Science Fair was a very competitive event this year. We have some great projects from 6th, 7th and 8th grades with six of our students being invited to the county science fair on the 12th of March. Sixth, Seventh, and Eighth grades are visiting the University of California Research Center in Hopland for a two hour course in fire science. The two hours are fun-filled and very instructive for our junior high students.

MUSIC

While it's indeed strange not to be blazing through a Mardi Gras set this month, our music classes have been hustling and bustling with merry melodies and raucous rhythms. K-2nd are connecting the dots, identifying and exploring the links between those two foundational concepts of music making vocally, through movement, and on pitched percussion instruments. 3rd-5th are getting down to the nitty-gritty of the visual staff representation of pitch and rhythm, melody and harmony, and tempi and dynamics on orff instruments, ukuleles, and keyboards. 6-8 are taking a kitchen sink approach to arranging and orchestrating some soul, blues, and american songbook standards, familiarizing themselves with charts, lead sheets, tablature, and other simplified forms of musical composition. Be on the lookout for shared video versions of some of the magic moments in the music building!
